## **BUILDING A NETWORK FOR LEARNING**

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### **Santa Maria della Vita**

The monumental site of Santa Maria della Vita, is the most important example of Baroque architecture in Bologna. It includes the Sanctuary, which houses the largest collection of terracotta sculptures of the Italian Renaissance, the *Compianto sul Cristo Morto* by Niccolò dell'Arca; the Oratorio dei Battuti, which houses the *Transito della Vergine* by Alfonso Lombardi, and the Museum of Health, situated in the old Santa Maria Della Vita hospital.

This church was founded in the second half of the 13<sup>th</sup> century by the confraternity "Battuti di S. Maria della Vita" which is one of the first confraternities emerged in Italy after the flourishing of the movement of the *Disciplinati* in 1260 in Perugia on the impulse of Raniero Fusani. Besides the flagellation's practice the members provided assistance to pilgrims and invalids in the adjacent hospital which is now disappeared.

The church - which is owed to the title of sanctuary- was enlarged between 1454 and 1502 and reconstructed at the end of the 17<sup>th</sup> century by the architecte G. B. Bergonzoni after a ruinous cave-in of the roof in 1686. The dome was built on the plan of Giuseppe Tubertini. The interior has an elegant and airy design and was built on an elliptic plane where the famous plastic group of the "Pietà" (*Compianto del Cristo Morto*) is to be admired, since it is one of the most vigorous and expressive masterpieces of the Italian sculpture, moulded by Nicolò dell'Arca in the second half of '400.

On the high altar there is the fresco "Madonna della Vita" dated back to the second half of the 14<sup>th</sup> century.


The history of Bologna begins somewhere around 1200 BC, the period of the Villanova civilisation. As early as the 6<sup>th</sup> century BC we find references to an urban centre which the Etruscans called Felsina. After being occupied by the Gauls, the town was conquered by the Romans in the 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC. and re-named Bononia. With the decline of the Roman Empire it came under the sway first of the Byzantines, then of the Lombards and finally of the Papal State of Rome. Bologna continued to flourish until it became an important centre during the age of the Communes, when it proudly proclaimed its independence as a free commune. It was here that the first university in Europe was born, in 1088. During this period the numerous towers for which the city is famous were erected by Bolognese families as signs of prestige. In the 16<sup>th</sup> century Bologna was incorporated in the Papal State, which enriched its architecture with many new churches. In 1796 French troops seized Bologna, but after the Congress of Vienna in 1815 the city was restored to the Church. Later, the Austrians took possession, but in 1860 Bologna was definitively annexed to the Kingdom of Italy.

### **Bologna's arcades**

Bologna has almost 24 miles of arcades! Protected from the sun and sheltered from the rain, you can enjoy the pleasure of strolling around the town in all seasons. The arcades (known as the *portici*) were built when the growing numbers of university students and teachers created an urgent demand for new lodgings. The upper storeys of the buildings were extended to make new rooms, leaving a covered space for pedestrians and for trading at street level.

### **Bologna University (1088)**

Bologna University came into being when famous law scholars known as the "glossators" were summoned to the city to make commentaries on the ancient Codices of Roman Law. Whereas other universities - the Sorbonne, for instance - were founded by the Church or by monarchs, the Studium of Bologna is an example of a secular establishment based on close links between the students and the Commune. The life of the University has remained closely linked with that of the city ever since.


